

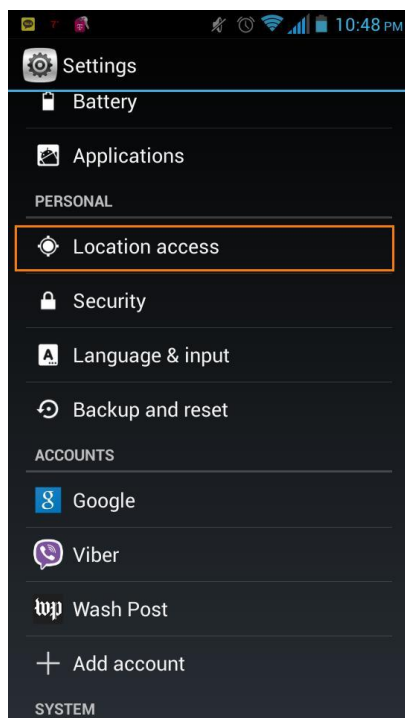
Confirming or changing your country store - Android

If you're having trouble with Google Play downloads on your Android device, the problem might be due to Google's location settings on your device. Google Play is linked with your Google account on your device. This account and its location settings apply to Gmail, Google +, YouTube, Google Drive, and Google Play on the device.

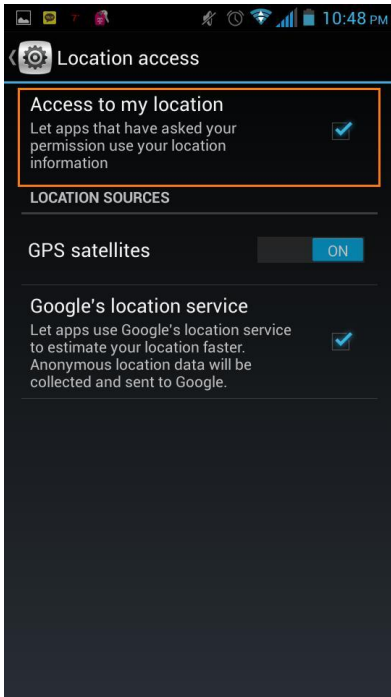
Therefore, to change your location settings on Google Play, you need to change the settings of your Google Account. After that you should be able to locate and download your country's app on Google Play.

Step 1: Open the Settings app on your device 

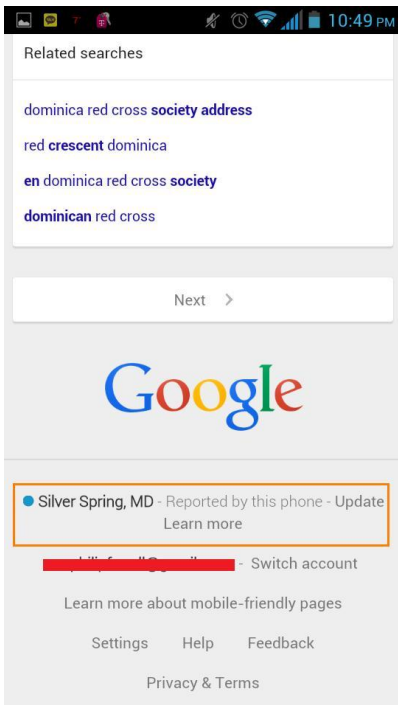
Step 2: Scroll down and tap on 'Location Access



Step 4: Ensure that Google can access your location. This means that if you are in your home country Google Play should, by default, automatically access that location and you will be able to access your app on the Play Store.



Step 5: Confirm Google is successfully logging your location by opening your device's internet browser and doing a random search. Scroll down to the bottom of the browser. Google will display your current location, and this will confirm to you that your Google account is correctly synced to your current location.



After you have confirmed this location setting on Google, you should be able to log onto the Play Store correctly and download your app.
