# Information for Participants in the 2019 CAP Workshop in Hong Kong

The 2019 Common Alerting Protocol (CAP) Implementation Workshop, 17-18 October, is in Mexico City, hosted by the <u>Secretariat of Integral Risk Management</u> and <u>Civil Protection</u>.. A CAP Train the Trainers session is all day on 16 October. Anyone interested in emergency alerting is welcome and there is no charge. The CAP Workshop and the CAP training session are in a Justice Superior Court of Mexico City building at Rio de La Plata 56, Cuauhtémoc, 06500 Mexico City.

## Mexico Entry Requirements

Travelers to Mexico must check their specific entry requirements which vary by nationality. <u>This site</u> shows a 2017 map indicating that nationals of 67 countries holding normal passports did not require a visa to enter Mexico as tourists or business visitors. If you do need a visa, be sure to apply for it as early as possible.

Currency in Mexico is the Mexican peso (MXN). Mexico electrical sockets are 120 volt, 60 Hz, and use plug types A and B. Wireless Internet access is available in the Workshop venue.
