## Language & translation

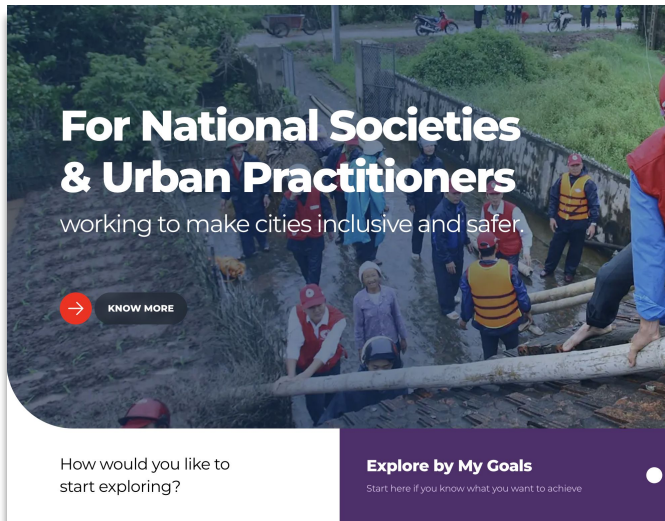

# What **Results** you will see

## *Finding Resources that match your goal*

- Estimated time needed to implement it
- Possible adaptations for different contexts

### Extreme Heat Risk Perception Survey Template

#### Tool Purpose

To support humanitarian actors, city systems and communities in understanding the risk perception of the most vulnerable communities to better develop actions to reduce their risks.

#### Key Features

Survey template for conducting heat risk perception studies.

#### Level Of Technical Expertise Required

Low to Medium. Designing and analysing the results of risk perception studies will require technical expertise that can be obtained from Meteorological agencies and or academic institutions in the country.

#### Estimated Time To Implement

- Adaptation into context: 3-6 weeks
- Adaptation into awareness campaigns: 3-6 months

#### Adaptations

- Translate and localize the guide and the survey
- Use the results in designing communication materials e.g. posters/social media kits in awareness campaigns.
- Partner with municipalities in designing the city heat interventions.
- Integrate into urban EVCA studies.

## Exploring tools in more detail

Once you find a tool that looks relevant, you can:

- Open it to explore further
- Download resources
- Share it with your team

You will also see suggested related questions. These help you discover additional tools you may not have considered—without starting your search again from scratch.

## A Final note

You do not need to explore everything at once.

Take your time, follow what feels most relevant to your work, and return whenever your priorities change.
