EXISTING STRUCTURES- AUTHORITIES' & NGO'S RESPONSE – LIVING CONDITIONS

KARA TEPE: Kiosks, tents and containers for shelters, few facilities for sanitation, used to operate as a registration centre, then as a transit one and afterwards (20/10) as a registration point again. The situation in Kara Tepe is constantly changing. The practice of issuing a ticket is also changing, resulting in the creation of control and management by the existing NGO's and volunteers who assist daily the overall function and structures.

MORIA: Still it is the main registration point but accommodation and sanitary facilities do not reach the necessary needs. Hot shower and hygiene issues were discussed on Thursday's coordination meeting. Furthermore, the need for separating boys from girls in the UM's is emphasized along with the bad conditions in the specific area. Specifically emphasized on the need for water supply and sanitary improvement. The fact that the specific camp is constantly expanding.

General remarks on target population:

Clothing and food items are needed, now that the temperature has dropped, especially in the night. Population seems cooperative despite their hassle. The population in the north is quite nice to them and very helpful, despite the fact that they do not want to have a first stop station near their residence. On the other hand, they understand that there is a need of having one spot for assembling migrants and transferring them to Moria and/or Kara Tepe.

On Thursday's coordination meeting, many NGO's suggested that the Northern part of the island needs to be further supported. UNHCR stated the need of coordination among the different actors.

RC visits: Head of the DRC delegation in Lesbos, Nelima Lassen, head of the GRC delegation in Lesbos, Mario Geiger, and the desk officer, Mechthild Richter, Head of the Social Welfare Division of the HRC, Zefi Thanasoulas, and representatives of Swedish RC.

Additionally, DRC delegation was amplified by Despina's Konstantinides, PSS specialist and Yan Eric's, IT specialist, arrival and affiliation in the team.

All visibility material and information leaflets of the HRC-DRC team, has been delivered and during the following days all necessary activities will be carried out.

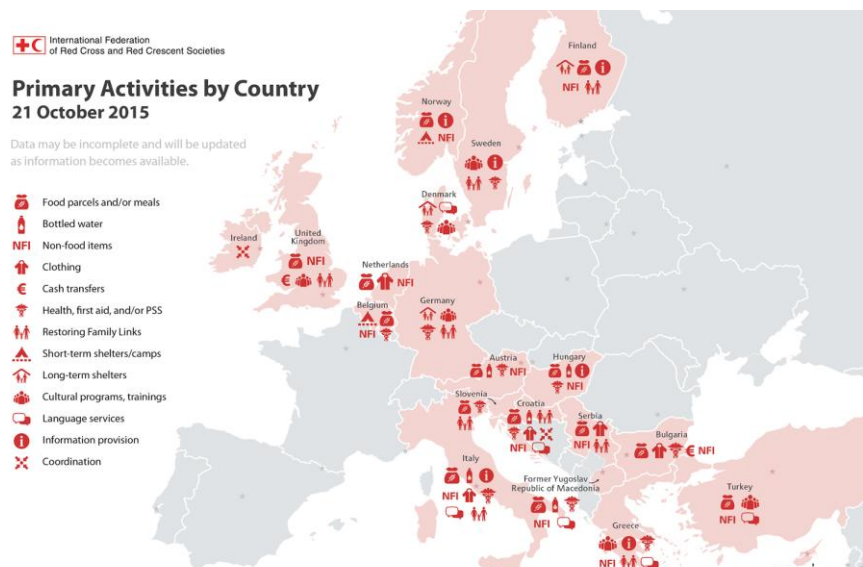

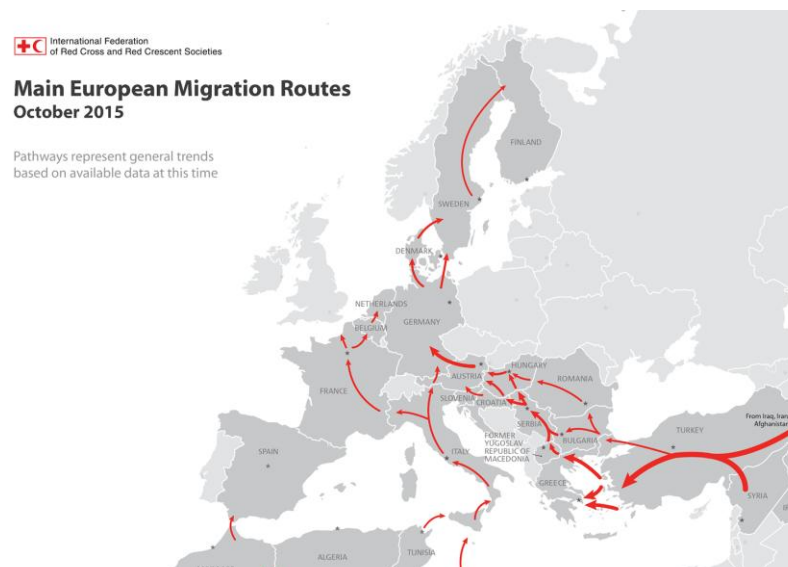

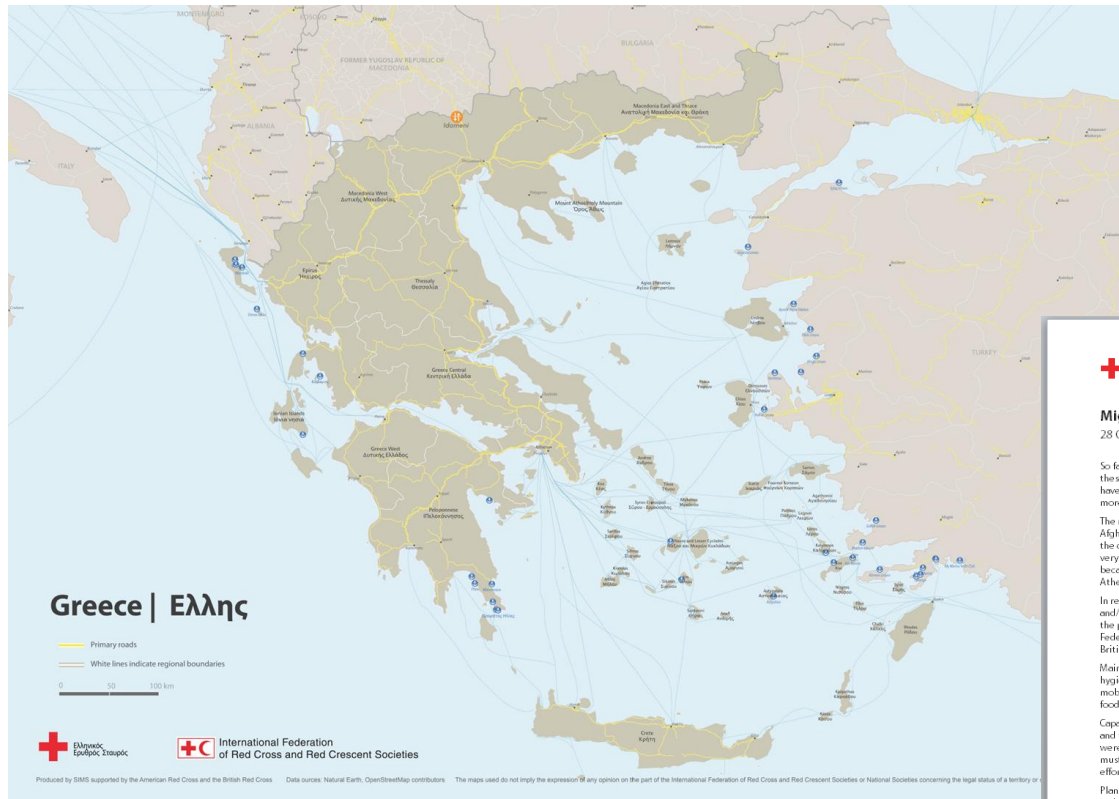

Migration Crisis Brief: Situation and Response in Greece 28 October 2015

So far this year, over 690,000 migrants have entered Europe by the Mediterranean sea, and nearly 80% of these people arrived in Greece. Despite worsening weather and sea conditions, daily arrival numbers have actually increased recently, reaching a record of over 10,400 people per day. Bad weather has led to more frequent shipwrecks; coast guards and rescuers are overwhelmed.

The majority of migrants consist of Syrians from fairly high socioeconomic backgrounds, as well as Afghans, Iraqis, and other nationalities. Migrants' crowded boats arrive at the Greek islands at all hours of the day and night, and may wash up anywhere along an island's coastline – making response activities very difficult. In addition to the physical danger of the sea crossing, migrants are particularly vulnerable because they often lack information about where they have landed (many believe they have arrived in Athens), how to get to their desired destination, and what legal details and options apply to them.

In response to these overwhelming needs, the Hellenic Red Cross currently conducts relief distributions and/or other response activities on the islands of Chios, Lesbos, Kos, and Samos, as well as in Athens and the primary border crossing at Idomeni. The Movement has assisted Greece with support from the Federation (including Basic Healthcare ERU's), a new ICRC deployment, and bilateral assistance from the British, Danish, and German Red Cross societies.

Main Red Cross response activities include basic healthcare, first aid and rescue, psychosocial support, hygiene promotion, provision of information and guidance, provision of connectivity (wifi hotspots, mobile recharging stations, and phone cards), Restoring Family Links, and relief distributions (including food parcels, hygiene kits, baby parcels, survival kits, water bottles and blankets/sleeping bags).

Capacity is a key challenge for the Hellenic Red Cross. Many branches had been inactive for several years and the affected islands generally lacked a volunteer base; when the crisis began, only four volunteers were active on the island of Kos. Furthermore, volunteers typically have full-time employment, so they must be spread across multiple shifts. Despite these challenges, volunteer recruitment and training efforts are underway, field coordinators have been deployed, and the volunteer base is slowly growing.

Plans for the upcoming months include additional volunteer mobilization, scaling up relief distributions and response activities and winterization – including distributions of warm clothing and high-thermal blankets.

Since 17 August, 156 Hellenic Red Cross volunteers have distributed over **18,000 relief goods** and assisted over **32,500 people** through other response activities – together with the support of the Movement. Highlights include:

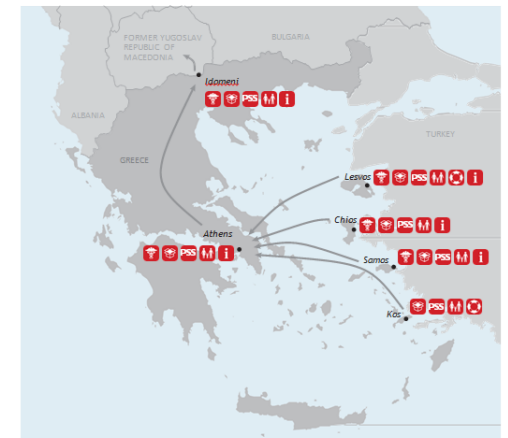
